

# **New SPARK! Programs Requirements and Trainings**

### **SPARK! New Program Requirements:**

- 1. Must be held in a cultural institution
  - a. All SPARK! programs must be held in a cultural institution- art museum/gallery, public/history/cultural museum, nature center, children's museum, theater, ballet, etc...
- 2. Programs are for the <u>at-home care couple/family</u>
  - a. Group programs are ok only if they are *in addition* to your core SPARK! program as a separate program group programs are encouraged after the first year of facilitation a SPARK! Program.
- 3. Programs must be once a month (at minimum)
  - a. All SPARK! locations try to keep a standard monthly day and time for consistency; avoid scheduling with other competing programs in the area.
- 4. Design programs for the early to early mid-stage person with dementia and include *multi-sensory* engagement practices
- 5. FREE to all participants (families)
- 6. *All SPARK! Program institutions must have go through trainings* with the Alliance, ADRC/Alzheimer's Association, Conferences, etc; trainings also include observations of two other SPARK! programs before starting
- 7. Funding must be secured by the institution
  - a. New organizations can apply for a two year grant with Bader Philanthropies, if they are located in Wisconsin; funding must be secured for trainings.
- 8. All marketing materials must use the SPARK! logo and tagline
- 9. **Must become an active member of the SPARK! Alliance** -facilitators for a *year* are encouraged to take an active role in the Alliance and are welcome to present at conferences.

## SPARK! TRAINING for NEW SPARK! Organizations:

## ALL SPARK! institutions must go through trainings and attend conference/retreat

- 1. On-site full day (or more) training at new organizations location (\$\$ for trainer fees/travel expenses)
- 2. Observation of at least two programs! (\$\$ for travel)
- 3. Attend annual Conference or Retreat (\$\$ for travel)
- 4. Participate with the SPARK! Alliance quarterly meetings (virtual) and trainings

## **On-site Training includes:**

- Alzheimer's and Dementia Training with local ADRC/Alzheimer's Association for all staff and volunteers.
- **SPARK! 101** -History/Development/Planning/ Logistics/ Community partnerships/ Marketing/ Accessibility & Inclusion best practices/Evaluations /Registration & Costumer Service
  - For all staff and volunteers involved; can also include any board or management staff interested in learning more about the program.
- Multi-Sensory Engagement Training- Learn the art of engagement for people with memory loss and their care families in a three hour session. Explore how to develop and implement programs using a multi-sensory approach with art, music, objects, poetry/spoken word, movement, breathing, touch, smell, and so much more. Participation is a requirement!
  - For all facilitators/staff and volunteers working directly with the program
- Site Visit/Tour of facility and program spaces
